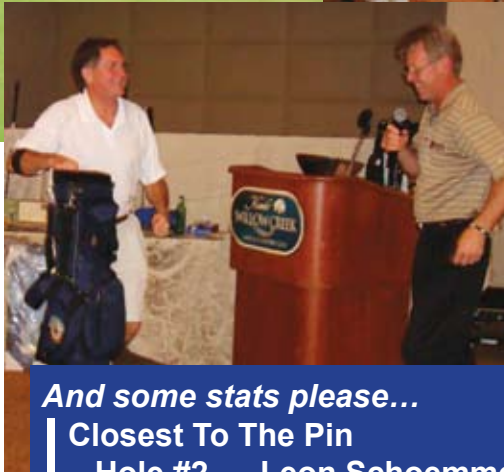

The Long Island JATC — A First Class Labor-Management Education Model

The Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee (JATC) for the Electrical Industry of Nassau and Suffolk Counties is a partnering initiative by both labor and management which produces “the best-trained Electricians in the Electrical

Industry,” — a signal accomplishment of which Long Island NECA and Local Union #25 IBEW are extremely proud.

Administered by three representatives of NECA; Michael Bender, president of Bana Electric Corp., Robert Kohlmeyer, president of CRK Contracting of Suffolk, Inc., and Christian Hedlund, president of Hedlund Electrical Corporation, and three from IBEW Local Union #25; Michael O’Grady, president, Alfred J. Mc Ateer, Examining Board Chairman, and Donald J. Fiore, Business Manager, our JATC sets a state-of-the-art standard for the entire industry.

Leading the training is Christopher Kelly, Training Director. Chris is a standout, energetic administrator

who blends his own strong formal education with heavy work experience to provide a practical academic environment for the students.

He presides over a learning curriculum that over five years takes an apprentice from beginner, where he/she will learn the basics of electricity and wiring, to a skilled professional...a Journeyman electrician. Over the course of the training, the apprentice learns theory and gains hands on experience, accumulating a number of important certifications as well as OSHA and other safety credentials.

A tour of the facility reveals thirteen classrooms with just about every type of demonstration equip-

ment from the simplest doorbell installation to underground manhole replicas and pipe bending machinery. Two full time instructors, Tom Dunne and Vincent D’Ambrosio, two office staff, Clare Gould and Emily Kaiser and twenty-six part time instructors assist Chris.

Chris is a natural teacher. In fact, before becoming Training Director in 2004, he had been an evening and then full time instructor in our JATC program. His ideas have moved the program forward at a fast pace with innovation and 21st century applications. He holds a BS in Engineering and has spent twenty-eight years in the construction field, eighteen in the electrical industry where he rose through the ranks from apprentice through foreman and assistant shop

superintendent to his present role directing the JATC. He has numerous professional affiliations and industry honors, and is a member of Chi-Epsilon, the National Engineering Honor Society.

The Kelly home is a busy place, too, with Chris’ wife Linda and their four children, Christopher, Brett, Alexandra, and Darah, plus Biscuit, their 2-year old golden retriever filling up Chris’ leisure time.

Legislative Report

School Licensing Bill Vetoed

In one of his last acts of a disappointing tenure as Governor, Gov. Paterson vetoed the bill that required that all outside work valued at more than \$10,000 performed on school buildings located in areas where there are local licensing laws would have to be done by licensed electricians and plumbers. His veto message was faulty and equally disappointing. He claimed that the bill would have increased costs to school districts (not true). He also said that he could find no evidence that using unlicensed electricians or plumbers has caused any harm to school districts and that using licensed contractors would not ensure the quality or reliability of their work!

We won a tough battle in both the Senate and the Assembly to get the bill passed. Unfortunately, we ran up against a Governor who just doesn't "get it." I have been in contact with Rich Schaffer, the Counsel for the plumbing contractors. We have already started the process to have the State Legislature consider the bill once again and are confident that we will get a better airing with the new Governor. •
